Children who know many songs and rhymes when they start school often do better at reading and writing

Do actions to match the words. e.g. Point up as you say "up"; pretend to drive as you say "car".

Choose songs that match how they feel. Sing loudly then quietly, quickly then slowly. Leave gaps for children to fill in the words. e.g. twinkle twinkle little

Let them use

instruments.

Try saucepans,

wooden spoons,

or pasta in

plastic bottles.

Bounce or rock

babies in time

to the music.

Use your own voice (instead of a CD) Children don't mind if you make mistakes!

Make up songs about what you're doing. e.g. this is the way we tidy up.

Repeat songs over and over again.

Add sound effects and funny voices. e.g. Clap hands, say "beep beep" or hiss like a snake.
